CHICAGO, IL - - Final plans are underway for the Asian American Coalition of Chicago's 30th Annual Lunar New Year Celebration, "Celebrating Three Decades of Unified Leadership and Services" to be held Saturday, February 23, 2013 at the Hyatt Regency O'Hare, 9300 West Bryn Mawr Avenue in Rosemont. The Vietnamese American Community will, for its fourth time, host the Lunar New Year Celebration and an Asian American Conference.

AACC previously announced that this year, it will hold a full-day conference, with the goal of educating and engaging over 2,000 people who are expected to attend. The festivities kick off at 9 a.m. with a Community Health Fair, followed by an afternoon Job Fair, a Conversation with Four University Presidents, a Global Business Forum, AAPI Identity Workshops for high school students, Leadership Workshops for college students, an Interfaith Prayer Session, and will conclude with an evening black-tie optional gala. (*Program subject to change, pending final scheduling.*)

Cocktail reception begins and exhibits open at 5 p.m.; opening ceremonies are at 6 p.m., followed by dinner, entertainment and awards ceremonies until approximately 10 p.m., ending with dancing until midnight.

ASIAN AMERICAN COALITION 30th ANNUAL LUNAR NEW YEAR CELEBRATION - - ADD ONE

An event held on this grand of a scale only once a year, Lunar New Year is traditionally the single largest organized annual event in Chicago's Asian American community. According to the 2010 Census, the Asian Pacific American population in Illinois numbers approximately 586,934, or 4.6% of the statewide population.

Every year a different Asian community takes turn playing host of Lunar New Year. This year it is the Vietnamese American Community, which has thrice before (1989, 1997 and 2005) held the gavel for the Asian Pacific American community's most important event of the year. Nghia Sinh International holds the leadership honors.

"The Vietnamese American community is proud to be hosting the 30th Annual Asian American Coalition of Chicago Lunar New Year Celebration for the fourth time," said Doug M. Nguyen, 2013 Chair of the Asian American Coalition of Chicago Planning Committee, in a prior statement. "People of all ages are welcome to come for the morning health fair, business expo, job fair, educational and student workshops, or cultural extravaganza at our evening gala," he said.

Numerous dignitaries traditionally attend the festivities, including the Asian consular corps, elected and appointed governmental officials, political candidates, top business and corporate leaders, decision-makers and everyone who considers himself or herself a mover and shaker in and around, or for, the Asian Pacific American national movement.

"For 30 years, the mission of the Asian American Coalition has been to promote educational excellence, economic development, and increased government participation and access to all Asian Americans – this year's conference theme reflects our many proud accomplishments," said Dr. Nguyen-Trung Hieu, President of the AACC 2012-2013 Board of Directors, and one of its Founders, in a prior statement. (Hieu holds the distinction of being the only one founder, who has served the AACC for 30 continuous years, and has not been absent from any AACC annual event for the past three decades.)

Thompson**, the 37th Governor of the State of Illinois (1977-1991). This award is periodically presented to a non-Asian Friend of the Asian American community. The Coalition renamed its Grand Asian Award in 2010 after the late Cook County Circuit Court Judge Sandra Otaka.

The Asian American Coalition of Chicago is pleased to announce that **Lourdes G. Mon**, Principal, St. Anastasia Catholic School, located in Waukegan, Illinois, and an educator, public servant and community activist, has been named the **2013 Pan Asian American Ping Tom Memorial Awardee.** The Coalition renamed its Pan Asian Award in 1996 after the late legendary Chicago civic leader Ping Tom. Ping Tom was also one of the original founders of the Asian American Coalition.

Among numerous community and civic service affiliations, Mon has been a school principal for 29 years and an educator for 49 years. She is also a Melvin Jones fellow in the Lions Club International Foundation. She was a member of former Illinois Governor George Ryan's Transition Team on Education and the Workforce and a former Chair of Illinois Governor Jim Edgar's Asian American Advisory Council.

Mon previously served as President of the Board of the Asian Human Services of Chicago (AHS). Mon served as President of the Chicago Philippine Lions Club. She was also a Volunteer Commissioner in the Appearance Commission of the Village of Skokie, Illinois and held the position of Deputy Central Committeeman of the 9th District of the Republican State Central Committee.

Lourdes Mon also served as a three-time Chair (1986, 1994 and 2002) of the Board of the Asian American Coalition of Chicago Lunar New Year Celebration. In her spare time, she works as Host of the Asian Chronicle USA TV cable television, which appears on public access cable through Comcast Studios in Skokie, Illinois. Every November, Asian Chronicle TV USA holds an awards ceremony to honor exemplary Asians, philanthropic or humanitarians, who have paved the way or have made significant contributions for the betterment of the lives of the less fortunate, the impoverished and the underserved.

AACC... WHO WE ARE

According to the 2010 U.S. Census, the Asian Pacific American population in Illinois numbers approximately 586,934, or 4.6% of the statewide population. Approximately 92,304 Asian Pacific Americans reside in DuPage County, comprising 10.1% of DuPage County's population, with the bulk of the other 322,672 residents of Cook County, comprising 6.2% of Cook County's population. The 2010 Census shows that Asian Pacific Americans reside in Chicago in communities including West Rogers Park, Albany Park, Uptown, Armour Square and Bridgeport; in suburban Cook County in communities including Schaumburg, Hoffman Estates, Skokie, Niles and Morton Grove; and in suburban DuPage County in communities like Oak Brook and Naperville.

In 10 years, the Asian population in Illinois jumped 38.6 percent. In the Northwest suburbs, Asians now make up 12.7 percent of the population. They make up 10.1 percent of the population in DuPage County, and 6.3 percent of the population in Lake County. These are the 10 Illinois suburbs with the biggest percentage Asian population: South Barrington: 26.6%; Oak Brook: 23.2%; Hoffman Estates: 22.7%; Glendale Heights: 22.1%; Schaumburg: 19.8%; Vernon Hills: 19.3%; Buffalo Grove: 16.0%; Hanover Park: 15.2%; Streamwood: 15.0% and Naperville: 14.9%.
