Program overview was provided by Doug Nguyen and Dr. Hieu. The focus of the program is the celebration of three decades of sustained services of the Asian American Coalition. It will be a full day of activities... "From dawn to dusk". The morning program will begin with a keynote speaker, Secretary of Education at 9:00 a.m. then a health fair until 1:00 p.m. Families/Individuals will be provided bus transportation for the health fair. Lunch will be provided in the Grand Ballroom. There will be a job fair and a business expo in the afternoon starting at 1:00 p.m. There will be educational sessions from 1:30 p.m. to 2:30 p.m with University Presidents and workshops from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. – U.S. Dept. of Commerce on Global Business and Community Involvement for Next Generation. Unity Prayers will also be taking place at 4:00 p.m. From 5:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m., preparation/setup outside the Grand Ballroom. The celebration and dinner will begin at 6:00 p.m. Dr. Hieu said the above program is tentative and subject to change, pending on budget and confirmation of guest speakers.

Questions were brought to the floor... Is there a theme for the educational session? How will the individuals know if they would like to attend the session if they don't have any idea what will be discussed? It should be of interest to many such as financial challenges to attend colleges/universities. Who will be the backup to the keynote speaker if he is unable to attend? Doug said we are working on it.

Volunteer information sheets were handed out. Volunteers were solicited to serve on various committees such as Awards, Banquet Program, Program Book, Exhibits, Ticket Sales, and Sponsorship/Fundraising. The volunteer information sheets were collected at the end of the meeting. More solicitation will be had at the next meeting.

Luan Nguyen remarked on the status of the budget/fundraising. At this time, no funds have been raised. Doug Nguyen stated that 71 letters were sent and no responses have been received. Other members were attending meetings this evening to solicit sponsorship from the casinos. This is something that has not been done in the past but there seems to be interest from the casinos. Dr. Hieu expects to hear from American Family Insurance this week as to how much they will be willing to contribute. C.C. Chan indicated that she will be meeting with AARP and individuals from Hartford Ins. to discuss the sponsorship. There is commitment but she is unable to provide the information at this time.

Dr. Hieu covered policies of the AACC for the Host Community and Team Work... respect for, listen to, support of, and celebrate with the Host Community; welcome new ideas/suggestions, consider all, honor all and inform all.
