





M Invention



Finland heads this category for good reason (have a look at the sidebar on the previous page), but South Korea isn't far behind. The Asian nation is legendary for the quality of its schooling and the fervor of its students, who are among the likeliest in the world not only to complete their secondary education but then to go on and acquire college degrees. (South Korean parents are notorious for spending huge sums of money on test-preparation courses for their kids.) It's hard to imagine now, but back in the 1960s, South Korea's national wealth was on par with Afghanistan's. Today, it's one of the world's richest nations, in large part thanks to its focus on education.










